

Registration Update...overall course enrolments already exceed the high of last year. It is estimated that final figures will indicate an increase of approximately 6% over our 1982-83 enrolment.

In addition, University representatives will work with NRC and U of M colleagues in establishing arrangements for cooperative programming.

Several positive references to the University of Winnipeg were made in the North of Portage Task Force Report issued August, 1983. The University submitted a proposal to the Task Force in June of this year. Copies of both documents are available in Dr. McCormack's office fourth floor, Library Mezzanine.

In a letter to the President received August 18, the Minister of Finance of the Province of Manitoba described guidelines which have been established for 1984-85 grant provisions which apply to provincially funded agencies and institutions as well as provincial government departments. In his letter, the Minister stated that "overall, grant increases are expected to be set within the range of 0 to 5 percent." The actual percentage of increases are to be determined primarily on the basis of a formula which takes into account all the components of agency operating expenditures. The government plans to undertake a comprehensive review of program priorities, and the results of that review are to affect grant allocations. The Minister emphasized that the up to 5% allowance is not intended to serve as a guideline for wage settlements. "Obviously, such settlements must take into account the overall grant level. We would hope that they would also recognize the recent efforts through settlements expressed in flat dollar amounts, to provide relatively larger increases to employees in lower pay categories."

The University's Support Staff Council is seeking funds to establish a Henry Mak Memorial Bursary. The proposed award, an annual bursary of \$100, is intended to recognize, in a tangible way, the years of service given to this institution by Henry Mak while providing financial aid to a student in the Humanities. Contributions may be given to the Controller's Office, Room 102, Wesley Hall.
