SENATE DECISIONS

The following are highlights from the meeting of the Senate held Monday, March 19, 1984:

1. Declined to make changes in the regulations currently governing the administering of class tests at the end of term.
2. Referred the various submissions concerning changes in the structure of academic sessions to its Committee on Academic Development and Curriculum for review and recommendation no later than the regular May Senate meeting.
3. Approved that, prior to the signing of a contract between the University and a sponsoring agency or government to provide a university preparation programme, the Admissions and Registration Committee be required to vet the contracted programme to ensure that successful participants may meet the admission requirements at its completion.

LEITNER TO LECTURE AT UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG

Isabella Leitner, survivor of the Holocaust and author of Fragments of Isabella will give a public lecture at the University of Winnipeg on Thursday, March 29 at 8:00 p.m. in Riddell Hall Cafeteria.

Mrs. Leitner is one of the 50,000 to emerge alive from the German concentration camps in which 6 million of her fellow Jews perished. Mrs. Leitner will speak primarily through her book, published in 1978 and praised by many as one of the most sensitive accounts of the horrors of the Holocaust.

The lecture is sponsored jointly by the University of Winnipeg and Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, Israel.
