At its regular meeting held Wednesday, January 16, 1985, the University's Senate made the following decisions:

- Approved a revised statement on academic misconduct to replace the current entry in the University's General Calendar.
- 2. Approved first term final examination grades for release to the students.
- 3. Approved the 1985 86 sessional dates for inclusion in the University's General Calendar.
- 4. Approved for recommendation to the Board the agreement for academic cooperation between the Shaanxi Bureau of Higher Education and the University.
- Approved three students to graduate with the B.A. degree and one with the B.Ed. degree.
