SENATE HIGHLIGHTS

At its regular meeting held Thursday, February 14, 1985, the University's Senate made the following decisions:

- 1. Approved a policy which requires undergraduate students to withdraw from the University if they accumulate more than a set number of voluntary withdrawals on their record. Subsequent re-admission would be by way of appeal to the Admissions and Registration Committee.
- 2. Approved a method of setting the Voluntary Withdrawal deadline date each year for full courses.
- 3. Approved a revised procedure for the disbursement of awards monies and for the recovery of any credits resulting from the reduction of course loads by award winners.
- 4. Approved a modification to the terms governing the award of General Proficiency Scholarships.
- 5. Approved a change to the terms of an existing award.
- 6. Approved for transmission to the Universities Grants Commission comments on two proposed new programs at the University of Winnipeg.

7. Accepted a revision in the policy governing the acceptance of students who have been suspended from professional faculties at the University of Manitoba.

John W. Grant, United Church historian will give a lecture entitled 1925 Revisited, 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 26 in 1L11. The lecture will commemorate the founding of the United Church of Canada sixty years ago, and will reveal the hopes and intentions of those persons who were its leaders.
