The City of Winnipeg Streets and Transportation Department advises us that Portage Avenue from Colony to Furby Street will undergo pavement reconstruction beginning May 6. This project will necessitate the physical closure of one side of the roadway to vehicular traffic. During replacement of the east bound roadway, two lanes of traffic in each direction will be maintained on the west bound roadway; and during replacement of the west bound roadway, two lanes of traffic in each lane of traffic will be maintained on the east bound roadway. Approximately five months will be required to complete the project and parking will be restricted during construction. We thought you should hear the news from us first.

SENATE DECISIONS

At its regular meeting held Thursday, April 11, 1985 the University's Senate made the following decisions:

1. Approved specific admission requirements, additional to those currently in effect, for admission to the Faculty of Arts and Science.
2. Accepted the offers of two new prizes and approved the accompanying terms of award.
3. Approved the rewording of the terms of the Collegiate Entrance Awards in order to make those terms more precise.
4. Approved the restructuring of the Entrance Scholarship Programme by requiring at least five 300 credits in order to qualify and by making available more higher value scholarships.
