BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The following are highlights from the Board of Regents meeting held Monday, May 27, 1985:

The President's Report: The Committee of Presidents of Universities in Manitoba met on May 3 at Brandon University. Subjects dealt with were National Universities Week, Inter-Universities North, and future increases in academic fees.

Other items in the report were: decisions from the May Senate Meeting, Vacation and Professional Travel Plans, YWCA Woman of the Year Award, Election of Alan Artibise as SSFC President-Elect, Award to Printing Services, Coming Events, the 1985-86 UWFA Executive Council, the 1985-86 UWSA Executive, and the AUCC Position Statements.

Advisory Committee on Information Services: Approved a policy for use of the The University of Winnipeg logo, effective January 1, 1986:

1. The approved University of Winnipeg logo should be used on all publications and designated printed material of the University (including those of its departments and associated agencies);
2. Departments may use their own established logos or designs along with the approved University of Winnipeg logo, but never exclusive of it;
3. The University crest may be used on letterhead in place of the logo;

4. Approval of the President is required for use by a department or agency of any slogan or motto, (other than an event specific slogan);

5. The Collegiate Division will be excepted from the specifics, but not the intent of the policy insofar as they have established it is necessary for them to be seen by their target audiences as a unique body, identified at the high school level. They shall, however, consistently include the name of the University of Winnipeg in all promotions and publications, and use of their logo and motto shall be approved by the President.

Pension Committee: Items in the Pension Committee Report included: Trust Agreement with Investors Trust; Investment Sub-Committee; Employee Statements; and 1984 Financial Statements.

Finance Committee: Items in the Finance Committee Report included: the 1984-85 Preliminary Statement of Operating Income and Expenditure; 1985-86 Operating Budget; 1985-86 Miscellaneous Capital Budget; 1985-86 Ancillary Services Budget; 1985-86 Unrestricted Trust Funds; and Revised Collegiate and Theology Budgets.

The wall will also recognize the athletes whose dedication to their sport has resulted in the excellence of the Wesmen teams in the form of an annual plaque bearing the names of team members in their final year of participation. A Retirement Reception will be held on June 19, 1985 to honour retiring staff. Everyone is invited to come and go reception which will take place in Riddell Hall Dining Room from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m. A presentation will be made by Dr. Farquhar on behalf of the University at 3:00 p.m. Those being honoured are Valdina Black, (Office of the Registrar), Mavis Turner (Counselling Services) and Helen Tinling (Office of the Faculty of Theology).
