# Vice-President of Finance & Administration Retires

The University community extends a fond farewell to John Law. Law retires this month after serving as The University of Winnipeg's Vice-President (Finance and Administration) since 1987.

"John has a strong understanding of the University and what it stands for. Off campus he has been a tireless supporter of The University of Winnipeg, and he has been a great support to me," says University President Marsha Hanen.

Among his numerous accomplishments while vicepresident, Law worked hard to foster improved relations with the Universities Grants Commission, thus ensuring better understanding of the needs of the University. The University of Winnipeg has benefitted from his guidance in a time of increasing financial restraints.

Law developed and issued the University's first approved "Policy Manual" to ensure all employees operate by the same guidelines. He also adapted a priority-based budgeting system to support departments in the University.


Before joining The University of Winnipeg, Law served the Saskatchewan government for 10 years. His positions included Deputy Minister of Advanced Edu-

cation and Manpower and Deputy Minister of Parks and Renewable Resources.

Prior to his years in public service, Law held the rank of Colonel in the Canadian Armed Forces (Air Force).

"John has been a mentor and a friend," says Steve Coppinger, associate vice-president (finance and admin.). "He was very proud of the work done by the support staff, and will be especially missed by them."
