



### UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG PREPARATORY PROGRAM APPROVED

The University of Winnipeg Senate has approved a University Preparatory Program to be offered cooperatively through the Division of Continuing Education, the Faculty of Arts and Science, and the Department of English. The program has been developed in response to the need for improved services for students at risk of academic failure - particularly mature students, those who speak English as a second language, and those entering with low high school grade averages.

The program, which requires completion of 90 course hours, has three core components:

Academic and Personal Plan-

ning; Basic Composition/Writing Skills; and Study Skills. The emphasis of the program is on individualized guided learning in an instructor-supervised environment. As students develop their skills and gain confidence in their ability to handle the academic work, they will more easily make the transition into the traditional classroom environment where assignments are completed independently. Alternatively, students who are unable to cope with the academic materials at this level may choose to defer entry into the university, or may seek other post-secondary opportunities.





Seventy - five people, including members of the Western Canada Pictorial Index Board, attended a meeting at The University of Winnipeg Athletic Centre on May 14. The staff of the W.C.P.I. gave a slide presentation which traced the evolution of agriculture in the West. A video of the Austin Fair, produced by Bruce Hanks, was also screened.

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### **BOARD HIGHLIGHTS APRIL 27,1987**

FACULTY PRESENTATION

Dean McIntyre introduced Dr. Saul Olyan of the Religious Studies Department, who spoke of his interest and research in the history of Israelite Religion. Two areas of research that have arisen out of the declared monotheism of the Israelites, he said, have been the "problem of Yahweh's consort" and the treatment in the Old Testament of God's attributes as an extension of deity or as deities in themselves. He is currently working on the editing of one of the as yet unpublished Dead Sea scrolls.

### CHAIR'S REMARKS

Dr. Candlish reported on her meetings in Edmonton with the Chairs and Vice-Chairs of governing bodies of other Canadian universities.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Meetings with Premier and Mayor - Dr. Farquhar reported that, during the past month, he met with both Mayor Norrie and Premier Pawley. Both the Mayor and the Premier, he noted, value their roots in our institution as alumni and appear to be authentically interested in and supportive of our progress and plans.

Notable Students' Achievements. - The University of Winnipeg's May, 1985 Silver Medalist, Maureen Moynagh, recently placed first among 60 applicants for Ph.D. studies in France, at the International Scholarships Competition of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada. She was also ranked second out of the full slate of 160 candidates for international scholarships to study in all countries.

Elizabeth Martin, who is graduating this month with an Honours degree in Economics, is one of 26 students accepted into the graduate programme of the Stanford University School of Business. She will receive full tuition and living expenses for the next four years to complete her Ph.D. Elizabeth was one of the first winners of the Sir William Stephenson Scholarship.

A University of Winnipeg student, Jen Schellenberg, was awarded third prize in the national 1986-87 Senior Undergraduate Competition in Greek-English/French Sight Translation, presented by the Classical Association of Canada.

Decisions from April Senate Meeting - Dr. Farquhar reported the following decisions made by the University's Senate at its regular meeting on Monday, April 13, 1987:

approved the setting (a) back of the voluntary withdrawal deadline date in first term by two weeks;

(b) approved the awarding of the Certificate in Remote Sensing to one student;

approved revisions to the content of the Certificate Program in Administrative Management;

approved an addition to (d) the qualifications that may be presented for admission as a Mature Status student:

authorized certain pre-(e) pared comments on the University of Manitoba proposal to introduce a Co-operative Program in Civil Engineering to be sent forward to the Universities Grants Commission; and

(f) approved the removal of the probationary status from the procedural policy and the checklist with regard to research on human subjects.

Announcement of NSERC Awards

- Dr. Farguhar reported that the University was awarded an NSERC General Research Grant for 1987-88 in the amount of \$51,000. In addition, he reported that research grants totalling \$246,314 were awarded to nineteen faculty and NSERC Postgraduate scholarships were awarded to seven University of Winnipeg students.

COWCUP Meeting - Dr. Farquhar reported that the annual spring meeting of the Council of Western Canadian University Presidents was held in Vancouver on April 15 - 16. Among the items discussed were: National Forum on Postsecondary Education; federal fiscal reform; research; national science policy: employment equity; nursing programs; pending federal legislation; and visa students.

Dr. Farquhar reported that he is pleased to appoint Steve Klassen as Radiation Safety Officer at The University of Winnipeg.


### COOPERATIVE DEVELOP-MENT WITH CBC

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
